Billy Strings and Don Julin

Billy Strings and Don Julin play Traditional American String Band music with energy levels usually associated with extreme sports. Billy Strings is a 21 year old, tattoo-covered guitar picker and singer about whom we will surely be hearing for years to come. For over 30 years, Don Julin has built a reputation as an exceptionally eclectic and versatile mandolin player. These boys will take you back to the high lonesome sound of yesterday's bluegrass. No super-slick nash-pop here. This is your granddaddy's bluegrass delivered with the pedal to the metal intensity of a moonshine runner.

Heartland Klezmorim

Heartland Klezmorim has been performing Klezmer music throughout the mid-west since 2006. Band members are David Klein (trumpet, cornet, flugelhorn), Ben Godoshian (percussion), Chris Hamilton (bass), (multi-instrumentalist) Drew Howard, Susanne Garber (violin), and "super size" Will Metz (tenor sax). The music of the Heartland Klezmorim is a combination of foot-tapping old and new Klezmer tunes, yiddish folk melodies, and jazz interpretations of music from the yiddish theater. This is a recipe for enjoyable listening and dancing. Heartland Klezmorim observes the traditions in Klezmer music as well as adding a few new sounds.

Lads of the North

Lads of the North is a tight musical trio hailing from Bloomington, IN., an epicenter of traditional music in the United States. The band is anchored by Grey Larsen on piano. Flanking Grey is Eric Schedler on accordion. The third member of the trio is Sam Bartlett, who plays an intricate and propulsive mandolin and tenor banjo that electrifies musical arrangements. The Lads play music that is traditional but still pulsing, stuff that insists you grab a partner and dance. The Lads also love nothing more than to entertain a sitting audience with medleys of tunes from Celtic lands, seductive compositions, musical humor, and outrageous stunts. This is vaudeville and dance hall rolled into one.
