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# **Rhythm Stage**

#### YES! Wheatland's new Rhythm Stage will be complete this Spring!

The one-of-a-kind performance venue is nestled in the woods west of Middleground and will serve as a site for percussion and dance classes, various instrument workshops, drum circles, and other musical performances.

The venue's unique design is the inspiration of Ryan Edwards - a Wheatland instructor, performer, and all-around-inspiring dude. Ryan, along with WMO Board member Paul Sachs, architect Wayne Appleyard of SunStructures Inc., and John Stadtfeld of JBS Construction worked collaboratively over the last several years to design this beautiful, functional performance venue. A Steering Committee has also been instrumental in shepherding the project forward. The Team is currently working with professional lighting designers to create a lighting ambiance at the site that will highlight the beauty and intimacy of the venue design and its location in the woods.

The venue, without a doubt, serves as a testament to the Organization's commitment to traditional music and support for the percussive arts.

A "grand opening celebration" of music, percussion, and dance is currently in development to unveil the new venue to festival goers this September. Be sure to check it out!

# Arts Weekend

#### **PERFORMANCES BY:**

### Good Foot Dance Company accompanied by Maivish

Good Foot Dance Company explores the complex cultural twinings of the root-system of American traditional dance, from Appalachian flatfooting, to tap, to contemporary urban dance. By mixing and remixing vernacular dance and music and bringing a critical and historical inquiry to the shared history of American dance cultures, they put on an energetic performance, while raising questions about connectivity, continuity and social responsibility. Good Foot Dance Company is Matthew Olwell, Becky Hill and Emily Oleson.

Maivish explores the landscape of time-honored melodies and songs and comes home along new pathways, making music with vibrant energy and delight. Gathering traditions from the British Isles, Ireland and America with a mix of original compositions, their performance is infused with lush vocal harmonies, inspired interplay and captivating spirit. At its core, the group is a collaboration between American fiddle Jaige Trudel and British born guitarist Adam Broome who have been performing together as a duo for over a decade. Joining them is Matthew Olwell on flutes, bodhran and percussive dance. Maivish will provide the music for Good Foot's dance workshops.

They will present a Dance Performance/Concert Saturday evening, 8:00pm, on Main Stage

### Drive South

Drive South brings together two seasoned musicians, Roger Brown and Mary Sue Wilkinson. Vocal duets, featuring tight harmony singing, are the perfect match for Brown's original American roots music and the classic country songs they both love.

Raised in the foothills of the Blue Ridge Mountains of North Carolina, Roger has toured extensively around the world, working as a session singer and guitarist. Roger's songwriting spans folk, country and blues. His finger style guitar work is unrivaled.

Mary Sue grew up in Iowa in a family that loved to sing and to dance. Her mom saved green stamps to buy her a little black Kay guitar when she was 12 years old. Since that time she has become one of the leading "pure" singers in the traditional music scene. Mary Sue is also the founder of Singing Heart to Heart and the Young at Heart Music program, providing music experiences for seniors.

# Ruby & The Retros

Ruby & The Retros is a northern Michigan band that individually has played around Michigan and other parts of the country for more years than they want to admit. They have played in too many northern Michigan bands to mention. The band consists of Ruby John (fiddle and vocals), John Warstler (rhythm guitar, clawhammer banjo, mandolin and vocals), Ann Whitford (hound dog bass, vocals), and Eldon Whitford (lead guitar, mandolin, Dobro and vocals). The Retros play old time American Roots music. This music was on the radio in the 1930s, 40s, 50s, and 60s, from such places as the Grand Ole Opry, Renfro Valley, WLS, WCKY, or XET from the Rio Grande. That was back before country genres had names to polarize their listeners.

Ruby & The Retros play the old styles that are now referred to as Old Time or Mountain Music, Celtic/Irish or fiddle tunes, honky tonk or classic country, bluegrass and western swing. Their songs are unpasteurized and organic without the modern slicked up sound or recording engineers' meddling.

They will present a concert Saturday evening, 8:30pm, on the Main Stage






