Operational Support Grant

Wheatland Music Organization was pleased to be awarded an Operational Support grant by the Michigan Council for Arts and Cultural Affairs (MCACA). The \$18,000 award will help us meet our mission of serving as a regional resource center for the preservation and presentation of traditional music and arts. A portion of the award was made possible by the National Endowment for the Arts (NEA). The funding will strengthen the overall organization by helping 300+ artists share their creative expression and toward administrative and other costs necessary to enrich lives with quality traditional arts programs during 2020. Wheatland offers a wealth of arts experiences — the annual Wheatland Music Festival, Traditional Arts Weekend, Summer Wheat and Winter Wheat, monthly dances, jamborees, Wheatscouts, ongoing Community Education programming, Archiving and Scholarships. Wheatland's success reflects the work done by 3 paid staff, 13 board members, 1000+ volunteers and hundreds of donors and members.

Wheatland Music Organization is one of the most active investors in traditional arts in the nation. Each year we reach about 30,000 people through the festival, winter wheat, traditional arts weekend, camp, and community programs, scholarships, lessons, dances and more. As

- a nonprofit charitable organization, all excess income goes back into strengthening the organization. You might consider making a legacy gift to carry Wheatland into the future:
- 1. Include us in your Will or Trust as a fixed amount or as a percentage of remaining assets.
- 2. Include us as a beneficiary in your retirement assets or as a beneficiary in your life insurance policy. You may be able to reduce your estate tax burden.
- 3. As a way to avoid Probate, your financial institution may allow you to add a "payable-on-death" (POD) or "transfer-on-death" (TOD) designation with Wheatland as your beneficiary on your bank accounts or Certificates of Deposit.
- 4. Consider a charitable gift annuity whereby you make a gift to a charity in exchange for a "stream of income." Because the interest rate received by the donor is based on the donor's age, a more mature donor will receive more income from the gift annuity than from a Certificate of Deposit or money market fund.
- 5. When you reach 70.5 years or older, you are required to make a required minimum distribution (RMD) from a tax deferred account like an Individual Retirement Account (IRA). If transferred directly to Wheatland without landing in your hands first, the amount you donate is not included as taxable income when figuring your taxes. At your direction, your IRA company can transfer an amount (up to \$100,000 per person, per year) directly from your account to Wheatland Music Organization, Inc. (EIN # 38-2176484) mailing it to P.O. Box 22, Remus, MI 49340.
- 6. Create a generational family plan. Let your children and grandchildren know how important Wheatland is to you and those you love.
