Jenine loved all kinds of art and music. She enjoyed out- of- the- way little art shops and art fairs with hand crafted items. Music played a key role in Jenine's life. She played the piano, guitar and flute. A popular wedding, funeral, and church singer, she also sang with her mother and sisters, and, for her family and friends. Her energy was unmatchable when cutting the rug' on the dance floor. A devoted mother and youth leader, Jenine always encouraged youth to reach their highest potential.

Friends and family have established a permanent and sustainable designated memorial fund in Jenine's name - an endowment within Mecosta County Community Foundation, an affiliate of the Fremont Area Community Foundation, www.tfacf. org, that serves Mecosta, Osceola, Lake & Newaygo Counties. The Jenine Stickler Memorial Fund earnings are distributed by Wheatland Music Organization to help youth with demonstrated financial need to obtain art 'tools and equipment' so they can take part in school, community, church and other personal arts pursuits. Included might be acoustical musical instruments (violin, bass, piano, flute, etc.) or art supplies/equipment (dance shoes, a potters wheel, etc.) Eligible children/youth live, or attend school, in Mecosta, Osceola, Lake, Newaygo or Montcalm Counties. It is the intention of the Wheatland Music Organization, Inc. to assist those with the greatest financial need and/or the greatest potential for growth.

Applications are considered on a first-come, first—served basis. The names of the awardees and purpose of award are published in the annual Wheatland Music Organization, Inc. festival program and/or in the organization's newsletter "Quarter Notes." Checks are only forwarded after the applicant has raised the additional amount necessary and purchase/lease agreements are confirmed and documented.

The Jenine Stickler Memorial Fund is to support individual children youth (ages 3 -18) – not groups. Each individual must apply separately.

Not all applicants are awarded. Applicants increase their chances of being awarded by:

- Clearly identifying skills to be gained that fit the stated purpose of the Scholarship fund,
- Completing the application themselves or with the assistance of a parent or guardian,
- Being a first time applicant,
- Listing the school they attend and their county of residence,
- Demonstrating the greatest financial need and/or the greatest potential for growth, and,
- Showing commitment by having raised a portion of the funds needed.

Applications need not be typed. Two reference letters must accompany the application, with at least one preferably from someone in the traditional arts and knowledgeable of the applicant's potential. Reference letters must not be by family members or anyone financially benefiting from the award. Also, applicants should attach a photo, appraisal or page from catalog describing the item to be purchased, including price. If possible, send the application package two months before the purchase or lease or equipment, tools or instrument. Awards usually range from \$75 to \$500.

Before the end of the year, awardees are required to provide a written report using the Fund's evaluation form (Awardee Report) which is also completed and signed by your instructor, parent or mentor. Awardees are also encouraged to publicly acknowledge receipt of the scholarship. Note: By accepting this scholarship, recipient expressly consents and agrees to the use of recipient's name and/or likeness in any WMO publication or promotional material. Recipient further agrees that any photos produced by WMO incident to this consent are the exclusive property of WMO.

POLICY STATEMENT

The goal of the Scholarship Committee is to evaluate applications fairly and make distributions to eligible candidates.

- 1. Youth whose families with higher incomes are encouraged to show matching funds at least equal to the scholarship grant request amount. Youth applicants are encouraged to show commitment by having raised at least a portion of the funds themselves.
- 2. The Committee shall be comprised of at least three persons of whom one is a Board Member and at least one youth.
- 3. The Committee shall strive to evaluate applications within two weeks of receipt by Committee.
- 4. The Fund shall be funded by a line item allocation each year and by donations from individuals and groups (gifts may be earmarked to a particular art form or geographic area not to an individual or group of individuals). Remaining earmarked donations may be carried over.
- 5. The Committee shall base its decision making on the criteria outlined in the Elyce Fishman Scholarship Fund guidelines. At least 2/3 of the allocation will be reserved for those seeking assistance for traditional arts endeavors with the intention of phasing out fine arts awards.
- 6. The Committee reserves the right to restrict the number of awards to the same applicant to not more than three and may choose to reduce the award amount with repeat applicants.
- 7. The Committee shall not give preference to applicants who are, or whose family members are, employees, staff, officers, directors, committee members, or contributors. All applicants will be evaluated based on fund's criteria. The Committee makes selections on an objective and nondiscriminatory basis.
- 8. Committee members shall disclose any relationship to applicants and abstain from voting if a direct or indirect financial or personal interest is noted.
- 9. The WMO office shall maintain records, including those who received or were denied funds, for a period of at least 7 years. The records shall include the completed application, the response and the followup report.
- 10. Scholarship award cannot be applied towards costs already incurred and can only be applied toward future expenses.
- 11. Awards are typically \$75 \$500. Applicants are received Feb. 1 Dec. 1; those received after Dec. 1 may not be considered until Feb. 1 or after.
- 12. Note: In the event an award of \$600 or more is paid to an applicant, an IRS 1099 is required.
