



The Elyce Fishman Scholarship Fund

The Wheatland Music Organization, Inc. (WMO) is a nonprofit organization whose mission is to serve as a regional resource center, and to preserve and present traditional music, dance, arts and crafts. One of the ways that WMO meets this mission is through the Elyce Fishman Scholarship Fund.

Elyce was an associate member of the Wheatland Music Organization, Inc. She was a lover of children, fine and traditional arts, and the humanities. She was a strong advocate of individual opportunities, rights and personal growth. Her life took many paths. This scholarship program, supported by an annual allocation, and donations from the general public, celebrates Elyce's life by making it possible for others to enhance their personal growth, experiences, and education related to the traditional arts. The purpose of the Elyce Fishman Scholarship Fund is to provide funding to enable Michigan residents, giving preference to children and adults from the mid Michigan area, to enhance their growth and education in the areas of traditional music, dance, arts and crafts. Traditional arts are learned person to person, passed from generation to the next, and influenced by culture, family, ethnicity, and era; they often represent a place or a group of people and can express the thoughts and feelings of a point in history. Examples of traditional music are folk music, olde time, bluegrass, Cajun, French Canadian, blues, Great Lakes, and more. Traditional dance styles may include clogging, Celtic, step-dance, and more. Puppetry and storytelling are examples of traditional performance art. Traditional craft arts include stone building, pottery, basket making, quilling, quilting, bead work, spinning, wood carving and more. Applications are accepted by individuals wishing to take part in workshops, lessons, performances and other activities, instrument rental/purchase and arts supplies. It is the intention of the Wheatland Music Organization, Inc. to assist those with the greatest financial need and/ or the greatest potential for growth.

Approximately 50 awards are made each year. Applications are considered on a first come first serve basis. The names of the awardees and purpose of award are published in the annual Wheatland Music Organization, Inc. festival program and/or in the organization's newsletter "Quarter Notes." Checks are only forwarded after the applicant has raised the additional amount necessary and plans are confirmed.

The Elyce Fishman Scholarship Fund is to support individuals – not groups. Each individual must apply separately.

Not all applicants are awarded. Applicants increase their chances of being awarded by:

- Requesting funding for activities that fit the Scholarship Fund's stated purpose and clearly name the skills to be gained. Completing the application themselves
- Being a first time applicant.
- Demonstrating the greatest financial need and/or the greatest potential for growth.
- Showing commitment by having raised a portion of the funds needed.

While there are no fixed deadlines, applications are received between Feb. 1 and Dec. 1. Applications received after Dec. 1st may not be considered.

Applications need not be typed. Two reference letters must accompany the application, with at least one preferably from someone in the traditional arts and knowledgeable of the with at least one preferably from someone in the traditional arts and knowledgeable of the applicant's potential. Reference letters must be completed by persons other than family members. References should be from parties who will not benefit financially by the award Also, applicants should attach copies of brochures or registration forms showing the event they wish to attend. If possible, send the application package two months before the activity or event.

Awards usually range from \$75 to \$500. Within 30 days following the end of your traditional arts study, awardees are required to provide a written report using the Fund's evaluation form (Awardee Report) which is also completed and signed by your arts instructor.

Awardees are also expected to publicly acknowledge receipt of the scholarship.

POLICY STATEMENT

The goal of the Scholarship Committee is to evaluate applications fairly and make distributions to eligible candidates.

- Adults and youth applicants whose families have higher incomes are encouraged
 to show matching funds at least equal to the scholarship grant request amount.
 Youth applicants are encouraged to show commitment by having raised at
 least a portion of the funds themselves.
- 2. The Committee shall be comprised of at least three persons of whom one is a Board Member and at least one youth.
- 3. The Committee shall strive to evaluate applications within two weeks of receipt by Committee.
- 4. The Fund shall be funded by a line item allocation each year and by donationsfrom individuals and groups (gifts may be earmarked to a particular art form or geographic area not to an individual or group of individuals). Remaining earmarked donations may be carried over.
- 5. The Committee shall base its decision making on the criteria outlined in the Elyce Fishman Scholarship Fund guidelines. At least 2/3 of the allocation will be reserved for those seeking assistance for traditional arts endeavors with the intention of phasing out fine arts awards.
- 6. The Committee reserves the right to restrict the number of awards to the same applicant and may choose to reduce the award amount with repeat applicants.
- 7. The Committee shall not give preference to applicants who are, or whose family members are, employees, staff, officers, directors, committee members, or contributors. All applicants will be evaluated based on fund's criteria. The Committee makes selections on an objective and nondiscriminatory basis.
- 8. Committee members shall disclose any relationship to applicants and abstain from voting if a direct or indirect financial or personal interest is noted.
- 9. The WMO office shall maintain records, including those who received or were denied funds, for a period of at least 7 years. The records shall include the completed application, the response and the followup report.
- 10. Scholarship awardees for lessons must complete study within a twelve month period following award.
- 11. Awards are typically \$75 \$500. Applicants are received Feb. 1 Dec. 1; those received after Dec. 1 may not be considered until Feb. 1 or after.

 Note: In the event an award of \$600 or more is paid to an applicant, an IRS 1099 is required.
